Who can join 4-H?

Any youth in Kindergarten through one year post high school graduation (grade 13) is eligible to join a 4-H club. 4-H is open to everyone! Adults can become involved as volunteer leaders.

When can you join?

You can join 4-H at anytime during the year, but the best time to join is in fall when the 4-H year begins. The 4-H year runs from October 1 - September 30.

When & where are club meetings?

Each club has its own meeting date and location. Crawford County has 7 different clubs that meet at different times and locations throughout the county.

What do 4-H clubs do at meetings?

Club meetings should include group-building activities, business, and educational programs. There are usually five general things that might happen at a 4-H club meeting: conduct business meeting, recreation or social activities, project work, community service work, and special interest programs. Depending on the season, depends on what the meeting could be devoted to. Example: during the summer months, meetings could be devoted to projects members are exhibiting at the Crawford County Fair. Winter months could be more community service activities with nursing homes, etc.

Who can join 4-H?

Any youth in Kindergarten through one year post high school graduation (grade 13) is eligible to join a 4-H club. 4-H is open to everyone! Adults can become involved as volunteer leaders.

Is 4-H just for farm kids?

NO! 4-H is open to **ALL YOUTH** in both rural and urban areas. Although popular 4-H projects involve dairy and livestock, there are a variety of other options. Some of the popular non-animal projects in the county include: Art, Clothing, Gardening, Foods & Nutrition, Legos, Photography, and Woodworking.

How to get started?

The first step in joining 4-H is to join a club! There are 7 clubs to choose from in al areas of the county. Your club is your home base and involves members of a variety of ages and interests. The average club has 15-25 members, but could have as many as 50. All members attend the "general" club meetings, which are held monthly throughout the 4-H year. Each member can participate in different project groups. These meetings are variable and are under the guidance of volunteer project leaders.

How long are 4-H club meetings?

Many clubs meet for about an hour each month. This varies from month to month. About half of the meeting is the business meeting, then the second half is recreation, community service, or demonstrations.

How do I choose a Club?

Most families choose a club based on its meeting location and/or meeting day of the week. Most clubs in Crawford County meet on Sunday afternoons. Others choose a club because they have friends in that club. There are no residency restrictions (including county) when joining a 4-H club.

Families are welcome to "drop in" on a 4-H club to check out or contact the 4-H leader in charge of a club before joining a club. Once you find a club you like, enroll in the Crawford County 4-H Program, using 4-H online: https://wi.4honline.com
